### 1. Features of the Meiji University Exchange Student Program, Seminars ("Zemi")

#### (1) Classes

Of the 13,000 class sessions offered at Meiji University, 12,000 are conducted in Japanese. For this reason, those applying for admission to the exchange student program are generally required to have a certain level of Japanese-language proficiency. (However, the English Track of the School of Global Japanese Studies, the English Track of the Graduate School of Governance Studies, and the International Program in Architecture and Urban Design of the Graduate School of Science and Technology, or will be taking classes in English in the School of Business Administration/ School of Political Science do not require Japanese-language skills.)

#### (2) Academic Advisors, Seminars ("Zemi")

- (1) Exchange students are generally assigned an academic advisor and participate in seminars ("zemi") in which those advisors provide instruction directly to students. These seminars are comprised of 10–20 students and encourage active discussions with the advisors. Students participating in these seminars not only get access to direct counseling by their academic advisors, they are also able to interact with other students (excluding students in the English Track of the Graduate School of Governance Studies).
- (2) Not all students can participate in the seminars. Participation depends on Japanese-language proficiency and the number of seats available. Upon their arrival in Japan, exchange students will meet with their academic advisors and create study plans that include these seminars if appropriate.
- ③Students accepted into the English Track of the Graduate School of Governance Studies will not participate in a seminar. However, they must take a course called "research methods" conducted during their study-abroad term taught by the academic advisor the graduate school assigns to them. They must also take at least one class taught by that advisor.

### **3. Housing for Exchange Students**

Meiji University makes all decisions regarding dormitory and room assignments.

#### (1) Meiji University Izumi International House; for both women and men, owned by Meiji University

**Meiji University Izumi International House** is owned by Meiji University and was open in March 2009. It has 61 single rooms for exchange students and 8 rooms for researchers and lecturers invited from partner universities. Meiji University Izumi International House is closed to Meidai-mae station of Keio Line, which gives residents good access to Izumi, Surugadai, and Nakano campus

#### **5** Facilities

Students' resident area of Meiji University Izumi International House is divided into 9 units (separated by gender), with each unit housing 6–8 students. Each unit has individual dorm rooms and a shared dining area and laundry room:

(1) Interior shared facilities

Entrance hall: Mailboxes, vending machines, and public telephones

- (2) Facilities in each unit
  - (a) Shared facilities

Refrigerator, microwave, toaster, rice cooker, TV, cooking supplies (pot, frying pan, knife, cutting board, etc.); laundry area with coin-operated laundry machine

(b) Each room (one room is assigned to each student in the unit) (14.58  $\vec{m}$ )

A bed, bedding, desk and chair, curtains, air conditioner, wired internet access, and modular bath (bathtub and/or shower, toilet)

- (c) Remarks
  - Some dorm rooms may not have a bathtub, but all have a shower and toilet.
  - The units and rooms are not stocked with any other supplies (dishes, toilet paper, towels, detergent, etc.). You can bring these things with you to Japan or purchase them after arrival.
  - If you plan to use the Internet, please bring your own LAN cable. (Wireless Internet access is not available.)

#### 6 Rent and charges

- (1) Monthly rent are **JPY53,000** (Rent for 2014 Academic Year. It is subject to change.). Even if you leave the dorm for a time during an extended break, you will still be charged a rent for whole months. The rent includes an expense of Internet usage.
- (2) Utility expenses (water, electricity, and gas) are charged at cost according to the facility's prepaid system.
- (3) Use of a laundry machine costs JPY100 per time

#### **7** Regulations

- (1) Resident managers stay in the dormitory.
- (2) Residents do not have a curfew.
- (3) Meiji University decides which units and rooms will be used, and residents may not move to a different room or exchange rooms with other students on their own.
- (4) Students will not be allowed to move out during their occupancy period.
- (5) Visitors are not allowed to stay overnight at the dorm. They can visit the dorm from 8:00AM to 10:00PM.

#### (2) Komae International House; for both women and men, owned by a private company, Kyoritsu Maintenance

**Komae International House** is owned by a private company named Kyoritsu Maintenance and was open in March 2011. It has 145 single rooms with about 105 used for regular students, mainly Japanese, of Meiji University and about 35 for exchange students. Komae International House is conveniently located near Komae station of Odakyu Line, which gives residents good access to Ikuta campus

#### **5** Facility

Komae International House is divided into floors for male students and those for female students. Only the first floor is used by both men and women,

(1) Interior shared facility

Entrance hall: Mailboxes, reception area (dorm manager's office), guest room, laundry room, courtyard (smoking area), dining hall (lounge)

(2) Dorm room facility( $17.25 \text{ m}^2$ )

Bed, bedding, desk and chair, curtains, air conditioner, modular bath (bathtub, shower, toilet), sink, IH cooking stove, mini-refrigerator, Internet access, IP phone

(3) External shared facility

A parking for bicycle

- (4) Others
  - The rooms are not stocked with supplies (dishes, toilet paper, towels, detergent, etc.). You can bring these things with you to Japan or purchase them after arrival.
  - If you plan to use the Internet, please bring your own LAN cable. (Wireless Internet access is not available.)

#### 6 Rent and charges

- (1) Monthly rent are **JPY48,000** (Rent for 2014 Academic Year. It is subject to change.). Even if you leave the dorm for a time during an extended break, you will still be charged a rent for whole month. The rent includes an expense of Internet usage.
- (2) Utility expenses (water, electricity, and gas) are charged at cost.
- (3) Use of a laundry machine costs JPY100 per time
- (4) Building maintenance fee: JPY3,000 as one-time fee due upon move-in
- (5) Meal contract is available as follows

- Monthly contract for breakfast and dinner: JPY16,800/month
- > Daily contract for breakfast only: JPY378 per time
- > Daily contract for dinner only: JPY702 per time

#### **⑦** Remarks

(1) A resident manager and housemother serve in Komae International House

#### (2) <u>Residents have a curfew.</u>

The dormitory is open from 6:30AM to 0:00AM. The curfew is 0:00AM. If you are going to be late or are going to spend the night outside of the dorm, you need notify the resident manager in advance.

- (3) Access to floors and rooms occupied by opposite gender is not allowed.
- (4) Visitors are not allowed to access to resident area. Their access is limited to a lounge and communal place only.
- (5) Meiji University decides which units and rooms will be used, and residents may not move to a different room or exchange rooms with other students on their own.
- (6) Students will not be allowed to move out during their occupancy period.
- (7) Komae International House is not owned by Meiji University, but by a private company, Kyoritsu Maintenance.
  Please note that students need to follow the regulations set by Kyoritsu Maintenance.

#### (3) Tokyo Girls Student House; for women only, owned by a private company, Fuji Land

Tokyo Girls Student House was open in 1966 will be newly built and open in April 2014. A private company, Fuji Land, owns the property with 230 single rooms. Meiji University specially arranges its 6 rooms (as of Spring semester 2014) for exchange students. The dormitory has the best access to Nakano campus.

#### **5** Facility

Residents of a 6-room-unit will share a dining space named "Share Dining Room" Residents of individual rooms will share facilities in common areas.

(1) Interior common facility

Lobby, lounge, shared shower room, laundry machine, toilet, training room, common kitchen. Those who are assigned to the rooms other than 6-room-units can use this common facility.

  - (a) Rooms(7.4~10.6 m<sup>2</sup>) (for all rooms)

Bed, bedding, desk and chair, curtains, air conditioner, modular bath (bathtub, shower, toilet), sink, IH cooking stove, mini-refrigerator, Internet access, IP phone

(b) Shared Dining Room (for a 6-room-unit)

Refrigerator, microwave, rice cooker, dining table and chairs, AC, TV and Wi-Fi

- (3) Remarks
  - The rooms are not stocked with supplies (dishes, toilet paper, towels, detergent, etc.). You can bring these things with you to Japan or purchase them after arrival.
  - If you plan to use the Internet in your room, please bring your own LAN cable. (Wireless Internet access is not available.)

#### 6 Rent and charges

- (1) Monthly rent are **JPY50,000** (Rent for 2014 Academic Year. It is subject to change.). Even if you leave the dorm for a time during an extended break, you will still be charged a rent for whole month. The rent includes an expense of Internet usage.
- (2) Utility expenses (water, electricity, and gas) are charged at cost.
- (3) Use of a laundry machine costs JPY100 per time
- (4) Use of common shower costs JPY200 for 7 minutes with JPY100 for 4-minute extension.

#### **7** Regulations

- (1) Resident managers serve in the dormitory.
- (2) <u>Residents have a curfew.</u>

The curfew is 0:00AM. The dormitory is open from 6:00AM to 0:00AM.

- (3) Access of visitors is limited to lobby and lounge on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor. Male visitors are not allowed to enter the dormitory except for parents.
- (4) Meiji University decides which units and rooms will be used, and residents may not move to a different room or exchange rooms with other students on their own.
- (5) Students will not be allowed to move out during their occupancy period.

## 7. Exams, Grades and Academic Transcripts

### (1) Exams

As a rule, first-semester exams are held in late July while second-semester exams are held in late January. Grades are generally announced every semester. There are five possible grades: S (90 points or higher), A (80 to 89 points), B (70 to 79 points), C (60 to 69 points), F (59 points or lower: Fail). A grade of C or better is required to earn credits from a course.

Note: Methods for evaluating student grades differ by school/graduate school.

### (2) Academic Transcripts

After you complete your term of study, one (1) copy of your transcript in English will be sent to your home university.

## 8. Living Expenses

### (1) Living Expenses in Tokyo

Tokyo is known around the world as being one of the most expensive places to live. The average monthly expenses of an exchange student are listed below. Do your own research, and be sure you have the funds necessary to cover your expenses.

Rent (Ex: Izumi International House)	¥53,000 or more
Transportation	About ¥10,000–¥20,000
Meals	About ¥30,000 or more
Utilities (electricity, gas, water)	About ¥10,000
Phone	About ¥6,000
Total	About ¥115,000 or more

Notes:

- According to the Japan Student Services Organization, monthly living expenses in Tokyo are generally estimated to be about ¥150,000.
- If you are going to be moving into a new place, keep in mind that you will also have to buy new furnishings and other supplies. You will also have to pay rent and a deposit, and in most cases, other fees such as key money (remuneration paid to a landlord) and agency fees are also required.
